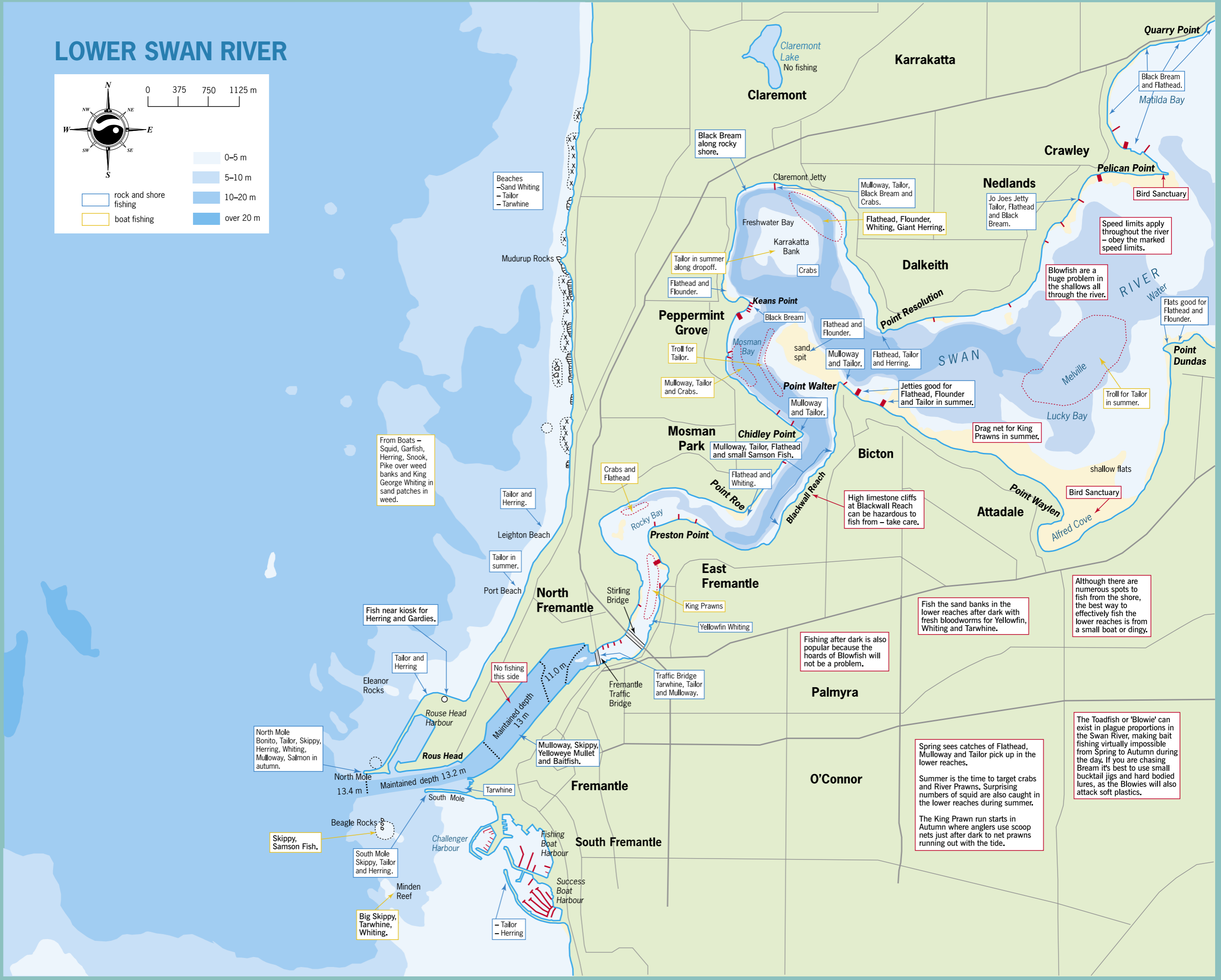
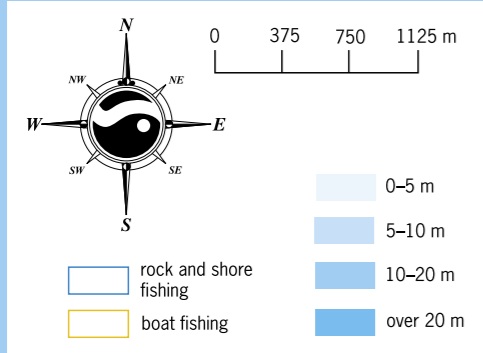


# LOWER SWAN RIVER



Beaches  
 - Sand Whiting  
 - Tailor  
 - Tarwhine

Black Bream along rocky shore.

Mulloway, Tailor, Black Bream and Crabs.

Flathead, Flounder, Whiting, Giant Herring.

Jo Joes Jetty Tailor, Flathead and Black Bream.

Speed limits apply throughout the river - obey the marked speed limits.

Blowfish are a huge problem in the shallows all through the river.

Flats good for Flathead and Flounder.

Tailor in summer along dropoff.

High limestone cliffs at Blackwall Reach can be hazardous to fish from - take care.

Bird Sanctuary

Although there are numerous spots to fish from the shore, the best way to effectively fish the lower reaches is from a small boat or dingy.

Fishing after dark is also popular because the hordes of Blowfish will not be a problem.

Fish the sand banks in the lower reaches after dark with fresh bloodworms for Yellowfin, Whiting and Tarwhine.

North Mole Bonito, Tailor, Skippy, Herring, Whiting, Mulloway, Salmon in autumn.

Mulloway, Skippy, Yelloweye Mullet and Baitfish.

Spring sees catches of Flathead, Mulloway and Tailor pick up in the lower reaches during summer. Summer is the time to target crabs and River Prawns, Surprising numbers of squid are also caught in the lower reaches during summer.

The Toadfish or 'Blowie' can exist in plague proportions in the Swan River, making bait fishing virtually impossible from Spring to Autumn during the day. If you are chasing Bream it's best to use small buckettail jigs and hard bodied lures, as the Blowies will also attack soft plastics.
